At this year’s Deanne Stone Memorial Breakfast, Dr. Rachel Fish will speak on the hopes and challenges Israel faces as it begins its 8th decade. Rachel Fish is Senior Advisor and Resident Scholar of Jewish/Israel Philanthropy at the Paul E. Singer Foundation in New York City. Most recently she was the Executive Director of the Schusterman Center for Israel Studies at Brandeis University. She completed her doctoral degree in 2013 in the Near Eastern and Judaic Studies department at Brandeis University, where she researched the history of the idea of bi-nationalism and alternative visions for constructing the State of Israel. She has taught at Brandeis University, Harvard University, UMASS Amherst and Tzion and Me’ah, Adult Jewish Education programs. In 2015 she held the Rohr Visiting Professorship at Harvard University, where she lectured on modern Israel and received the Derek Bok Certificate of Teaching Excellence. She is co-editor, with Ilan Troen, of the book Essential Israel: Essays for the Twenty-First Century.

## From The Rabbi's Desk



Cultivating an "Attitude of Gratitude"

My favorite prayer from the daily amidah is the prayer for gratitude (Modim Anachnu Lach). The phrase that always touches my heart-whether I read it in Hebrew or English- goes: "...for your miracles that are daily with us, and for your wonders and gifts that accompany us, evening, morning and noon."

With Hanukkah around the corner, we think of miracles on a grand scale: The unimaginable victory of the Maccabees over a far superior army or, in our own time, Israel's improbable victory in six days in June, 1967, over an array of surrounding armies that sought her destruction.

But the Modim prayer points us to a different kind of miracle: waking to life each day; unexpected kindnesses; the smile of a child we never imagined we'd see; the small wins of courage over fear that happen in a moment; the blessings of love and of friendship. Miracles all.

The Rabbis observe that, in the days of the Messiah, all of our required prayers will disappear, save one: the Modim prayer. Cultivating gratitude will never go out of style.

Albert Einstein put it this way: "There are only two ways to live your life. One is as though nothing is a miracle. The other is as though everything is a miracle."

## The Cantor's Voice



In the wake of the shooting in congregation Eitz Chayim/ Or L'Simcha in the Squirrel Hill neighborhood of Pittsburgh, I've been thinking about which tragedies I pay attention to and which ones I don't find the bandwidth to take note of, or which ones I've become inured against. I often manage to ignore tragedies in far-off lands. Many of us have become numb to everyday killings of "only" one person at a time, when we live in a country where there are on average about one hundred deaths a day due to guns, with roughly one-third being homicides and two-thirds suicides. Even the mass shootings can start to feel routine, as we react to the horror of a shooting in a school, a nightclub, or a church, and then let it recede in our minds. So I almost feel guilty when this shooting in Pittsburgh feels like it hits closer to home.

It may seem obvious, but for me, the shooting hits closer to home, because it took place in a synagogue. Somebody once said that every synagogue has the same cast of characters, just with different faces and names. I don't believe that, but still, as I've been reading about the victims, they feel familiar. The 97 year old woman who still attends shul regularly. The community doctor who also blows shofar on the holidays. Two brothers with special needs. The couple that always welcomes people into the community. The usher who helps greet people and get them settled. The stalwarts who arrive for the very beginning of services and make sure there is a minyan. Beyond this, due to the closeness of Jewish geography, there are very few degrees of separation to the Pittsburgh Jewish community. Some of us grew up in Pittsburgh. Others have friends or family there. We have friends with strong Pittsburgh roots or connections. I have close ties with several clergy there, including the rabbi/cantor at the synagogue where the shooting took place, someone who has always been kind and generous with his cantorial colleagues, serving as a mentor to younger cantors.

As horrible as the tragedy was, it has been heartening to experience some of the reaction to it. We appreciate the community joining together in song and prayer here at Temple Israel with a full sanctuary, the night after the shooting. We are so grateful for the outpouring of community support. Rev. Vicky Guest, of First Church in Natick, lit candles for each of the victims at her church, and read a translation of the mourners' kaddish. She and Rev. Eric Markman, along with other community leaders, joined us here at Temple Israel for our commemoration. We were so touched by Rev. Markman's visiting here with a delegation of the leadership of Hartford St. Presbyterian Church to pledge their support and bring a letter signed by their congregation.

I'm still figuring out what to learn from this tragedy, and what to teach my children about it. One lesson is that life is short and precious. Rabbi Eliezer taught (in Pirkei Avot) to repent a day before your death, and in the Talmud ( Shabbat 153a) he elaborates to his students that this means one should repent each day, since we don't know when we will come to the end of our journey on this earth. Another lesson is that anti-Semitism is still alive, even in 21st century America, which makes me want to wear our Judaism even more proudly and to stand up more firmly against all forms of bigotry. Finally, despite these terribly evil acts that we read about in the news and experience viscerally, most people act with goodness, and that it is up to us to add our deeds to the good ones around us, and to appreciate the good deeds of our neighbors. I hope that this tragedy may help each of us to appreciate life a little more, to hug our family and friends a little tighter, to reach out to our neighbors, and to add our words and actions to the ones around us that aim to repair and improve our society.

As we gradually come out of sorrow and towards joy again, I wish you a good Thanksgiving and Happy Hanukkah.

Why do you play so much?

\*It's because play is the work of a child! Research has shown that play is the most effective way to teach preschoolers. Here's some of the things we are learning: Social skills like sharing and self-control. Fine motor skills to prepare us for holding writing tools. Gross motor skills like coordination and balance. Creative expression and taking pride in our work. Literacy skills like book care and recognizing familiar words. Math skills like counting, sorting and comparing. Science skills like constructing, experimenting and observing.

## RELIGIOUS SCHOOL



The new year is under way, and I'm excited to share with you some highlights from just the first few months, as well as some changes we've made to make our program even stronger.

We kicked off our year with a Tashlich service and program at the South Natick Falls. Here, teachers and families had the opportunity to connect before the first day of class. At tashlich, our community also had a chance to meet Nitzan, our 2018-2019 Shinshin. My favorite moment was witnessing a group of 2nd-grade girls meeting Nitzan and moments later these 2nd graders were sprinting across a field to greet their other friends saying, "We met our new Shinshin, come to meet her!" Nitzan has easily connected with our students and teachers. We are so fortunate to be a part of the Shinshin program.

Youth services and programming on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur engaged more parents than ever before in leadership roles, and resulted in tremendous creativity and engaged students. We divided each service into shorter time blocks, and all groups had only two or three grades in it. This resulted in even more developmentally-appropriate programming.

Sukkot was an exceptionally busy week at Temple Israel. With the help of the Sisterhood, students prepared for Sukkot by making sukkah decorations. Special thanks to Debra Bieler-Klein for developing craft projects that were waterproof, and which we will be able to reuse next year. During Sukkot, our Religious School students took part in sukkah walks to different sukkot in our neighborhood. Thank you to the Greenberger/Savitz, Korenstein/Mael and Matross/Gordon families for hosting students, providing snacks and teaching about the mitzvah of hachnasat orchim/welcoming guests. Following our sukkah walks, students regrouped and, with their parents enjoyed Pizza in the Hut. We also welcomed two educators, Judith Kuchreich and Ella Hermony, from our partner school in Haifa, Habonim. Judith and Ella co-teach an elective English class for 5th and 6th graders. This year our 6th graders will build their Hebrew vocabulary, while the students in Haifa will

develop their English skills through a letter-writing project. On Simchat Torah, our younger students led songs during the hakafot, and our 6th and 7th graders led some of the verses from Ata Haraitah.

This year, we are introducing a history component in grades 5-7 and, in a few weeks, these students will visit the Touro synagogue in Newport, Rhode Island to learn about the Jewish community in colonial America. Earlier this month, our 6th and 7th graders had the opportunity to connect what they have been learning in their classrooms about Jewish immigration to the USA, with issues facing refugees in MetroWest. Students participated in a day of learning at TI, or attended a service project sponsored by the Jewish Teen Initiative and Jewish Family Service. During the service project, students learned about large and small ways to support and welcome refugees and asylum-seekers in our schools, neighborhoods and broader communities. They then rolled up their sleeves to put passions into actions. Projects included school beautification, gardening, and making care packages for refugees.

On Veteran's Day, our Religious School students will honor veterans by hearing stories of TI members who have served in the military or are currently in the military.

Our Rosh Hodesh and Madrichim programs continue to attract pre-teens and teens. With the support of the Sisterhood, later this year, we will offer a program for grade 7 mothers and daughters called Beneath the Surface. This new program will include a field trip to Mayyim Hayyim, the community mikvah in Newton.

Each month, I look forward to sharing the exciting things happening in our education program. It is a blessing to be supported in the holy work of Jewish education. Thank you for your partnership.
