A GUIDE TO LIGHTING YOUR HANUKKIYAH (MENORAH)

WHAT YOU NEED

- 1. A Hanukkah menorah or <u>h</u>anukkiyah—all candle holders should be of equal height, except the one for the **shamash** (the candle used to light all others) which is taller or shorter than the rest.
- 2. Hanukkah candles.
- 3. A window sill or table near a window on which to light the **hanukkiyah**. It is traditional to light the **hanukkiyah** in front of the window to share the miracle of Hanukkah.

HOW TO DO IT

- 1. Load your hanukkiyah the way one reads Hebrew, right to left.
- 2. Light only the shamash.
- 3. On Friday night, light the <u>hanukkiyah</u> before Shabbat candles, on Saturday night, after making Havdalah.
- 4. Early in the evening, but after dark, get the family together, stand and sing (or recite)

1. Barukh atah Adonai, Eloheinu melekh ha'olam, asher kidishanu bemitzvotav, vitzivanu lehadlik ner shel<u>H</u>anukkah.

1. Praised are You, Adonai, who rules the Universe, Who makes us holy through *mitzvot* and has given us the *mitzvah* of lighting the Hanukkah candle.

- 2. Barukh atah Adonai, Eloheinu melekh ha'olam, she'asah nissim la'avoteinu bayamim haheim, bazeman hazeh.
- 2. Praised are You, Adonai, who rules the Universe, Who made miracles for our ancestors, long ago, and continues to make them today.
- 5. On the first night continue with Shehecheyanu— on other nights, go to #6.

Barukh atah Adonai, Eloheinu melekh ha'olam, shehe<u>h</u>eyanu, vekiyimanu, vehigi'anu, lazeman hazeh.

Praised are you, Adonai, who rules the Universe, Who has granted us life, sustained us, and has brought us to this special time.

- 6. Light the candles, as you would read English, left to right.
- 7. Sing Hanukkah songs, and enjoy looking at the beautiful candles!
